



## Admission Policy

### United World International School (UWIS)

United World International School (UWIS) is a private, co-educational school that offers the Cambridge Curriculum from Kindergarten to Grade 12. UWIS aims to provide a high-quality education that prepares students for the challenges and opportunities of the 21st century. UWIS welcomes applications from students of all nationalities, cultures, religions, and backgrounds who share its vision and values.

#### Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to UWIS, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be of appropriate age for the grade level they are applying for. The cut-off date for each grade level is September 1st of the academic year.
- Demonstrate academic readiness and potential for the Cambridge Curriculum. Applicants for Grades 1 to 12 are required to take placement tests in English, Mathematics, and Science. Applicants for Kindergarten are assessed through an informal interview and observation.
- Provide official transcripts or report cards from their previous schools for the last two years (if applicable).
- Submit a completed application form with all the required documents and fees.

#### Admission Process

The admission process at UWIS consists of the following steps:

- Submit an online inquiry form or contact the Admissions Office to request information about the school and the application process.
- Complete and submit the online application form with all the required documents and fees. The application fee is non-refundable and does not guarantee admission.
- Schedule and take the placement tests (for Grades 1 to 12) or the informal interview and observation (for Kindergarten). The Admissions Office will contact the applicants to arrange the date and time of the assessment.
- Wait for the admission decision. The Admissions Committee will review the application and the assessment results and notify the applicants of their decision within two weeks. The decision may be one of the following: acceptance, conditional acceptance, waitlist, or denial.
- Confirm enrollment by paying the enrollment fee of \$300.00 and signing the enrollment contract. The enrollment fee is non-refundable and secures a place for



the student in the school. The enrollment contract outlines the terms and conditions of enrollment at UWIS.

## Tuition Fees

The tuition fees for UWIS are as follows:

- Kindergarten: \$8,000 per year
- Grades 1 to 5: \$9,000 per year
- Grades 6 to 8: \$12,000 per year
- Grades 9 to 12: \$15,000 per year

The tuition fees cover the cost of instruction, textbooks, materials, assessments, and extracurricular activities. The tuition fees do include the cost of uniforms, transportation, lunch, field trips, or other optional services or programs.
